RESOLUTION TO ACCEPT GRANT FUNDING FOR THE MONTGOMERY COUNTY ANIMAL CARE AND CONTROL THROUGH MADDIES FUND

WHEREAS, the Montgomery County Animal Care and Control (County) has been awarded an unrestricted grant through Maddie's Fund in the amount of \$1,000.00 to continue the animal welfare initiative for the Shelter Animal Count Program; and

WHEREAS, the partnership with Maddie's Fund supports shelters throughout the country by revolutionizing the status and well-being of companion animals in grants towards increased community pet lifesaving, shelter medicine education and pet adoptions; and

WHEREAS, the County will utilize the unrestricted grant funds towards the costs of neutering and spaying animals that are in the care of the shelter; and

In addition to all fees otherwise due, every solid waste disposal facility or incinerator collecting any solid waste in Montgomery County or Stewart County shall pay to Bi-County Solid Waste Authority a host fee of Seven Dollars (\$7.00) per ton of such solid waste, as may be changed from time to time by joint resolution of the legislative bodies of Montgomery County and Stewart County. Persons collecting, hauling or disposing of such solid waste at such solid waste disposal facility or incinerator shall be jointly and severally liable for the payment of the fee; provided, however, that only one fee shall be owed on each ton of solid waste. The funds collected by Bi-County Solid Waste Authority shall be used by it for solid waste collection, processing or disposal purposes.

Section 2. That this resolution shall take effect from and after its final passage by both the legislative bodies of Montgomery County and Stewart County, the welfare of Montgomery County and Stewart County requiring it.











Traffic by Fiscal Year






