on July 30, 1945, Corporal Edgar A. Harrell, United States Marine Corps, watched the USS Indianapolis sink into the Pacific Ocean after exploding, taking with it documents approving his promotion to the rank of Sergeant after receiving the Navy Commendation Medal and the Presidential Unit Citation for service aboard the USS Indianapolis: and

WHEREAS.

Edgar A. Harrell was born on October 24, 1924: attended Trigg County High School; later moved to Murray, Kentucky; enlisted in the United States Marine Corps in the fall of 1943; and was assigned to the USS Indianapolis in March of 1944; and

WHEREAS.

on that fateful day in 1945, Corp. Edgar Harrell was one of 1,197 men aboard the USS Indianapolis. of that number, 880 did not survive the approximately twelve minutes that it took for the ship to sink, leaving only 317 to survive the four and one-half days in the shark-infested waters; and

WHEREAS,

Corp. Harrell with the help of his kapok life jacket stayed afloat in the ocean for four and one-half days during which time he was plagued by sharks, hypothermia, severe dehydration and salt-water hallucinations: and

WHEREAS,

Edgar Harrell married Ola Mae Cathey one year after his near brush with death on July 25, 1947, and they have one son, David Alvin, a minister at Calvary Bible Church and one daughter, Cathey Mair, who lost her fight with breast cancer and now is with the Lord; and

WHEREAS,

Edgar Harrell owned and operated the Pella Window Company in Rock Island, Illinois for 35 years, retiring in 1985; and

WHEREAS.

today we honor Corporal Edgar Harrell for his service and dedication to his country and applaud his commitment to speaking to all age groups about World War II.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, CAROLYN P. BOWERS, Mayor of Montgomery County, Tennessee do recognize and honor Corporal Edgar Harrell for his dedication and valor while serving his country. RESOLUTION AMENDING THE BUDGET OF THE MONTGOMERY COUNTY TRUSTEE

WHEREAS, Montgomery County is one of the fastest growing communities in Tennessee, and the Montgomery County Trustee and the Montgomery County Commission want to meet the needs of the citizens; and

WHEREAS, the Montgomery County Trustee's Office has incurred additional expenses and work load due to this growth and office transition; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated § 5-9-407 provides a procedure for amending the budget, specifically providing that, "the budget, including line items and major categories, may be amended by passage of an amendment by a majority of the members of the county legislative body;" and

WHEREAS, the Montgomery County Trustee's Office would like to request an additional full time position which would accommodate the additional work being performed presently in the Trustee's Office; and

WHEREAS, beginning in 2012, the City of Clarksville began paying the Trustee's Office a 2% commission for collecting their delinquent taxes, which will offset a portion of the additional salary expense; and

WHEREAS, the Trustee's office has implemented a new tax billing software, eGov, which is requiring the use of overtime for manual verification of various information related to tax billing. This cost for overtime is not expected to be a recurring expenditure.

RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENT OF MONTGOMERY COUNTY TO REIMBURSE ITSELF FOR CERTAIN EXPENDITURES RELATING TO PUBLIC IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS WITH THE PROCEEDS OF BONDS OR OTHER DEBT OBLIGATIONS TO BE ISSUED BY MONTGOMERY COUNTY, TENNESSEE IN AN APPROXIMATE AMOUNT OF \$500,000

WHEREAS, on June 10, 2013, the Board of County Commissioners (the "Governing Body") of Montgomery County, Tennessee (the "County") authorized the issuance of general obligation bonds, which were issued on August 29, 2013, proceeds of which a portion thereof would be used to finance, in whole or in part, the acquisition of land and site development for and the design, redevelopment, construction, renovation, repair, improvement and equipping of public buildings including, but not limited to, the Veteran's Plaza (the "Veteran's Plaza"); and

WHEREAS, the project contingency fund has been depleted due to existing soil conditions. This required the removal of an unforeseen amount of soil, as well as the replacement of the existing fire protection waterline. The waterline would have been at an elevated risk for future failures due to the brittle nature of Asbestos Cement had it not been replaced with newer PVC material; and

WHEREAS, it is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners (the "Governing Body") of Montgomery County, Tennessee (the "County") to provide funds for the (i) completion of the Veterans Plaza improvements; and (ii) payment of legal, fiscal, administrative, architectural and engineering costs incident thereto (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, it is the intention of the Governing Body to pay all or a portion of the costs of the Project by the sale of general obligation bonds (the "Bonds") or other debt obligations of the County; and

WHEREAS, it is anticipated that it will be necessary to make expenditures in payment of costs of the Project prior to the issuance of the Bonds or other debt obligations of the County; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body wishes to state its intentions with respect to reimbursements for said expenditures in accordance with the requirements of final regulations applicable thereto promulgated by the United States Department of the Treasury.

(This Resolution was Amended as follows.)

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Montgomery County, Tennessee, as follows:

Section 1. It is reasonably expected that the County will reimburse itself for certain expenditures in an approximate amount of \$500,000 made by the County in connection with the Project. The County intends to reimburse all such expenditures through issuance of the Bonds or other debt obligations of the County. The expenditures made prior to the issuance of the Bonds or other debt obligations of the County are expected to be paid from the County's Debt Service Fund and reimbursement shall be made to said fund. Debt service on the Bonds or other debt obligations issued for the purposes herein is expected to be paid from unlimited ad valorem taxes to be levied on all taxable property within the County.

Section 2. The approximate principal amount of the Bonds, or other debt obligations of the County, are expected to be issued to finance the Project is \$500,000.

Section 3. This resolution shall be placed in the minutes of the Governing Body and shall be made available for inspection by the general public at the office of the County Clerk.

<u>Section 4</u>. It is the County's reasonable expectation that it will reimburse the original expenditures for the Project, or a portion thereof, from the proceeds of the Bonds or other debt obligations of the County.

<u>Section 5</u>. This resolution constitutes a declaration of official intent under Treas. Reg. §1.150-2.

Section 6. All resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed, and this resolution shall be in immediate effect from and after its adoption.

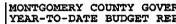
