WHEREAS, the Montgomery County Veterans Treatment Court wishes to add an additional part-time Veterans Court Case Manager to assist in the program as well as add additional funding to treatment services.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Montgomery County Board of Commissioners assembled in regular session on this the 14<sup>th</sup> day of October, 2019, that Montgomery County accept the additional grant funds in the amount of \$30,000 be used to fund a part-time Veterans Court Case Manager in the Montgomery County Veterans Treatment Court.

# RESOLUTION TO AMEND ANIMAL CARE & CONTROL REGULATIONS REGARDING REPORTING OF RABIES VACCINATION REGISTRATION FEE AND COLLECTION

WHEREAS, Animal Control Regulations were amended by Resolution 17-12-4; and

WHEREAS, since that time, evaluation of the current collection process and other observations have been made regarding the proper collection procedure for the collection of rabies vaccination registration fees; and

WHEREAS, William S. Powers, Curtis Johnson and Jason Hodges (the "Applicants") (i) are duly qualified electors and taxpayers of the County, (ii) have found that it is wise, expedient, necessary and advisable for the County to form a Sports Authority, and (iii) have made application to the Governing Body for the formation of a Sports Authority in accordance with the Act; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body finds that it is wise, expedient, necessary and advisable for the Applicants to form a Sports Authority for the County; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Montgomery County, Tennessee, as follows:

- 1. The Governing Body hereby authorizes the Applicants to proceed to form a Sports Authority for the County according to the provisions of the Act.
- 2. The Governing Body hereby approves the proposed form of Charter submitted by the Applicants to be used in organizing the Sports Authority.
- 3. The Governing Body hereby appoints the following persons as the Board of Directors of the Authority, for the terms of office opposite their respective names, commencing on the date the Charter is filed and approved by the Secretary of State of Tennessee.

#### CHARTER OF THE MONTGOMERY COUNTY SPORTS AUTHORITY

We, the undersigned natural persons, desiring to form a corporation under, and pursuant to, the provisions of the laws of the State of Tennessee, and particularly the provisions of Chapter 67, Title 7, Tennessee Code Annotated, as amended (the "Act"), do hereby certify as follows:

#### **ARTICLE I**

Each of us is a qualified voter and a taxpayer in, Montgomery County, Tennessee, and our respective names and residences are as follows:

#### **ARTICLE II**

The name of this Corporation shall be "The Montgomery County Sports Authority" (hereinafter "Sports Authority").

#### **ARTICLE III**

Permission to organize this Sports Authority has been granted by a resolution duly adopted by the Montgomery County Commissioner on the 14th day of October 2019.

#### **ARTICLE IV**

The location of the principal office of this Corporation shall be 1 millennium, Plaza Clarksville, Tennessee 37040.

#### **ARTICLE V**

The purposes for which the Sports Authority is organized are to operate within the meaning of the Act in planning, promoting, financing. constructing, acquiring, renovating, equipping and enlarging

buildings and operating sports complexes, stadiums, arenas, structures and facilities for public participation and enjoyment of professional and amateur sports, fitness, health and recreational activities.

The primary purpose of any and all such facilities shalt be the conduct of sports event, but use of these facilities need not be limited to those events. Furthermore, it is the purpose of the authority to conduct itself to do what is reasonable and necessary to attract professional sports franchises to the Montgomery County area.

#### **ARTICLE VI**

The Sports Authority shall be governed by a board of directors, having seven (7) directors, all of whom shall be duly qualified voters and taxpayers in Montgomery County, Tennessee. The qualification, terms of office, and duties of such directors shall be as provided in the Act.

#### ARTICLE VII

The Authority shall have perpetual existence.

#### **ARTICLE VIII**

The Sports Authority shall have all the powers authorized by applicable statutes, and particularly by the Act, including amendments thereto heretofore or hereafter adopted, and all powers incidental thereto or necessary for the performance thereof, including but not limited to:

- (1) Have succession by its corporate name for the period specified in the charter, unless sooner dissolved as provided in the Act;
- (2) Sue and be sued and to prosecute and defend, at law or in equity, in any court having jurisdiction of the subject matter and of the parties;
- (3) Have and use a corporate seal and alter the seal at pleasure;

- (4) Acquire, whether by purchase, construction, exchange, gift, lease, or otherwise, and to improve, repair, extend, equip, furnish, operate and maintain one (1) or more projects, which projects shall be within Montgomery County, including all real and personal properties that the board of directors of the authority may deem necessary in connection with the projects and regardless of whether or not any such projects shall then be in existence, and including the power to demolish such existing structures as may be on sites acquired when such structures are not needed for the project;
- (5) Operate, maintain, manage, and enter into contracts for the operation, maintenance and management of any project undertaken, and to make rules and regulations with regard to such operation, maintenance and management;
- (6) Employ, contract with, fix the compensation of, and discharge engineering, architectural, legal and financial experts, and such consultants, agents and employees, as may be necessary to carry out the purposes of this chapter and to provide for the proper construction, operation and maintenance of any project;
- (7) Lease, rent and contract for the operation of all or any part of any project for sports and recreational facilities, and charge and collect rent for the project and terminate any such lease upon the failure of the lessee to comply with any of the obligations of the lease; and include in or exclude from any such lease provisions that the lessee shall have the option to renew the term of the lease for such period or periods and at such rent as shall be determined by the board of directors;
- (8) Lease such space in a project as from time to time may not be needed for sports and recreational purposes to any other person, corporation, partnership or association for such purposes as the board of directors may determine are in the best interest of the authority or will help facilitate the purposes for which the authority was created, and upon such terms and in such manner as the board may determine;

- (9) Fix and collect rates, rentals, fees and charges for the use of any and all of the sports and recreational facilities of the authority;
- (10) Contract for the operation of concessions on or in any of the sports and recreational facilities of the authority;
- (11) Advertise within or without the state any of the sports and recreational facilities of the authority;
- (12) Sell, exchange, donate, and convey any or all of its properties, whenever the board of directors shall find any such action to be in furtherance of the purposes for which the authority was organized;
- (13) Procure and enter into contracts for any type of insurance or indemnity against loss or damage to property from any cause, including loss of use and occupancy, against death or injury of any person, against employer's liability, against any act of any member, officer or employee of the authority in the performance of the duties of such person's office or employment or any other insurable risk, as the board of directors, in its discretion, may deem necessary;
- (14) Accept donations, contributions, revenues, capital grants or gifts from any individuals, associations, public or private corporations, and municipalities, the state or the United States, or any agency or instrumentality of the state or the United States, for or in aid of any of the purposes of this chapter and enter into agreements in connection with the donations, contributions, revenues, capital grants or gifts;
- (15) Borrow money from time to time and, in evidence of any obligation incurred, issue and sell its revenue bonds in accordance with this chapter and the applicable provisions of Tennessee Code Annotated Title 9, Chapter 21, in such form and upon such terms as its board of directors may determine and as approved by the Montgomery County Commission, payable out of any revenues of the authority, including grants or

contributions or other revenues specifically provided to the authority, for the purpose of acquiring, erecting, extending, improving, equipping, renovating or repairing any project or for any combination of such purposes, and demolishing structures on the project site and acquiring a site or sites necessary and convenient for such project, including, but without in any way limiting the generality of the foregoing, architectural, engineering, legal, consulting and financing expenses, and including an amount sufficient to meet the interest charges on such revenue bonds during such estimated period or periods as may elapse prior to the time when the project or projects may become revenue producing and for one (1) year in addition to the estimated period; refund and refinance, from time to time, revenue bonds so issued and sold, as often as may be deemed to be advantageous by the board of directors; and, pending the issuance of its revenue bonds for the purposes in this chapter authorized, issue its interim certificates or notes or other temporary obligations;

- (16) Enter into any agreement or contract with any lessee who, pursuant to the terms of the Act, is renting or is about to rent from the authority all or part of any building or buildings or facilities, whereby, under such agreement or contract, such lessee obligates itself to pay all or part of the cost of maintaining and operating the premises so leased, and such agreement may be included as a provision of any lease entered into pursuant to the terms of the Act or may be made the subject of a separate agreement or contract between the authority and such lessee;
- (17) Mortgage and pledge as security for the payment of the principal of and interest on any revenue bonds so issued and any agreements made in connection with the bonds, any or all of the projects or any part or parts of the projects, whether then owned or thereafter acquired, and pledge the revenues and receipts from the bonds or from any of the bonds;

- (18) Enter into any contract to facilitate the location of a professional sports team in a project, if and to the extent permitted by the Act, make any payments required under the contract and borrow funds for the purpose of making any such payment, as provided in the Act, funded from revenues other than tax revenues;
- (19) Exercise all powers expressly given in its charter and establish bylaws and make all rules and regulations not inconsistent with the charter or the provisions of the Act, deemed expedient for the management of the affairs of the authority; and
- (20) Acquire, whether by purchase, construction, exchange, gift, lease or otherwise, and improve, repair, extend, equip, furnish, operate and maintain any roads, streets, highways, curbs, bridges, flood control facilities, utility services such as water, sanitary sewer, electricity, gas and natural gas, and telecommunications that the board of directors of the sports authority deems to be necessary, expedient or advisable in connection with the development or operation of any project; dedicate any such highways, roads or services to the public use; enter into any contract to facilitate these purposes and make any payments required under such contracts; borrow funds for the purpose of making any payment authorized by this subdivision (20); and pledge and otherwise use the revenues of the sports authority to repay such borrowed funds.

#### ARTICLE IX

In connection with any actual or possible conflict of interest, an interested person must disclose the existence of the financial interest and be given the opportunity to disclose all material facts to the directors and members of committees with governing board delegated powers considering the proposed transaction or arrangement. After disclosure of the financial interest and all material facts, and after any discussion with the interested person, he/she shall leave the governing board or committee meeting while the determination of a conflict of interest is discussed and voted upon. The remaining board or committee members shall decide if a conflict of interest exists, or approval of a conflict of interest may be obtained

from the Attorney General of the State of Tennessee, or from a court of record having equity Jurisdiction in an action in which the Attorney General is joined as a party.

#### **ARTICLE X**

The Sports Authority shall be a nonprofit corporation as provided in the Act, and shall constitute a public instrumentality of Montgomery County, Tennessee government, but shall have no power to obligate such Montgomery County, Tennessee government in any way, all as provided in the Act.

#### **ARTICLE XI**

This charter may at any time and from time to time be amended in a manner prescribed by the Act.

WE, THE UNDERSIGNED, apply to the State of Tennessee for a Certificate of Incorporation for the purposes declared in the foregoing instrument.

Please include this letter in the minutes of the next meeting of the County Commission and provide a copy to each Commissioner.

Our office received a request from Montgomery County (the "County") on September 5, 2019, for approval to issue three-year capital outlay notes in an amount not to exceed \$4,300,000 to be known as the "General Obligation Capital Outlay Notes, Series 2019" (the "Notes").

Included with the request was a copy of Resolution No. 19-8-6 adopted on August 12, 2019, authorizing the issuance of the Notes to finance the (i) acquisition of land for and the construction, improvement, repair, renovation and equipping of school buildings and facilities; and (ii) acquisition of land for and the construction, development, improvement, repair, renovation, acquisition and equipping of parks and park facilities and vehicles (the "Project"). The proposed note form was included with the resolution. Please send a copy of the executed note to us along with the completed Report on Debt Obligation (Form CT-0253).

#### Compliance with Debt Management Policy

The County provided a copy of its debt management policy, and within forty-five (45) days of issuance of the debt approved in this letter, is required to submit the Report on Debt Obligation that indicates that the debt issued complies with the County's debt policy. If the County amends its policy, please submit the amended policy to our office.

#### Note Approval

This letter constitutes approval for the County to issue the Notes by competitive or negotiated sale pursuant to T.C.A. §§ 9-21-604 and 9-21-607. Approval of the sale of the Notes is conditioned upon the County's compliance with all relevant provisions of Tennessee law.

Our office has relied upon the County's determination and representation as to the cost of the public works Project.

The County is responsible for compliance with Title 9 Chapter 21 Parts 1, 4, and 6 of the Tennessee Code Annotated, its debt management policy, and the timely payment of outstanding note principal and interest in accordance with the note provisions.

This letter and the approval to issue debt do not address the compliance with federal tax regulations and should not be relied upon for that purpose. The County should discuss these issues with a tax attorney or bond counsel.

This approval is valid for six months after the date of this letter. If the Notes have not been issued within that time, a new note resolution must be passed by the Governing Body and submitted to our office for approval.

#### Purpose, Terms, and Life

This Project meets the definition of a public works project in T.C.A. § 9-21-105, and the County may issue notes under the authority of Title 9 Chapter 21 of the Tennessee Code Annotated to finance such a project. The maturity of the Notes does not exceed the life of the proposed Project as attested by the local governing body. The submitted certified resolution and supporting documents appear to meet the requirements for the issuance of notes in Title 9 Chapter 21 Parts 1, 4, and 6 of the Tennessee Code Annotated. The maximum maturity for the Notes as authorized by the governing body is three years after the fiscal year of issuance.

In accordance with the requirements of T.C.A. § 9-21-604, a condition for this approval is that not less than one-ninth (1/9) of the original principal amount of the Notes is paid each year after the fiscal year issued with the balance being paid in the final year of the Notes. In its resolution, the County committed to pay not less than one-ninth (1/9) of the original principal amount of the Notes each year the Notes are outstanding. This meets the statutory requirement.

#### **Nonconforming Obligations**

Notes issued contrary to Title 9 Chapter 21 Parts 4 and 6 of the Tennessee Code Annotated or Notes not properly extended are nonconforming obligations. The Comptroller has the option to levy a penalty for notes deemed nonconforming obligations.

### **Director's Budget Approval Requirement**

By issuing debt under the authority of Title 9 Chapter 21 of the Tennessee Code Annotated, the County has placed itself under the budget approval authority of the Director of the Office of State and Local Finance for the life of any outstanding debt. This authority requires the County Mayor, as Chief Executive Officer, to submit within <u>fifteen days</u> of adoption the appropriation resolution with any necessary supporting documents to our office for official budget approval to document:

- the County's budget is balanced as required by state law,
- the County intends to pay all outstanding debt obligations, and
- the annual budget is prepared in a form consistent with accepted governmental standards and as approved by the Director.

Our office can require the County to provide any information or perform any audits necessary to ascertain that the County maintains a balanced budget paying all outstanding debt obligations. If the County is unwilling to submit to the requirements of T.C.A. § 9-21-403, this approval to issue the Notes is rescinded.

#### Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board (MSRB) - Required Disclosure

Local governments that issue municipal securities on or after February 27, 2019, should be aware that the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) adopted amendments to Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities Exchange Act that require reporting on material financial obligations that could impact an issuer's financial condition or security holder's rights. The amendments add two events to the list of events that must be included in any continuing disclosure agreement that is entered into after the compliance date:

- Incurrence of a financial obligation of the issuer or obligated person, if material, or agreement to covenants, events of default, remedies, priority rights, or other similar terms of a financial obligation of the issuer or obligated person, any of which affect security holders, if material; and
- Default, event of acceleration, termination event, modification of terms, or other similar events under the terms of the financial obligation of the issuer or obligated person, any of which reflect financial difficulties.

No public entity may enter into additional debt if it has failed to file the Report on Debt Obligation. Dear Mayor Durrett and Members of the Board:

Our office received a request from Montgomery County (the "County") on September 6, 2019, to approve the issuance of tax and revenue anticipation notes ("TRANs") for fiscal year 2020 in the amount of \$1,000,000 for the School Federal Projects Fund, as an interfund loan from the Debt Service Fund.

The request included the appropriation resolution adopted on July 15, 2019, by the County Commission authorizing the issuance of tax anticipation notes for fiscal year 2020. The County also provided cash flow forecasts prepared by the County Mayor's Office, which support the need to issue the TRANs for the School Federal Projects Fund and the ability of the County to make an interfund loan from its Debt Service Fund. The proposed note form was not included with the request. The executed note form should be submitted when the County files the Report on Debt Obligation, Form CT-0253.

Please provide a copy of this letter to all the members of the County Commission and present it at the next meeting of the County Commission.

The financial information presented by the County represents assertions of its financial condition and may or may not reflect the current or future financial condition of the County.

#### Limitations on Tax and Revenue Anticipation Notes

Counties in Tennessee are authorized to issue TRANs pursuant to Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 9, Chapter 21 for the purpose of meeting appropriations made for the current fiscal year in anticipation of the collection of taxes and revenues of that fiscal year, subject to the prior approval of the Comptroller of the Treasury.

The authorized amount of TRANs must not exceed 60% of the annual appropriation for each fund receiving proceeds from the loan and future revenues projected must be sufficient to provide for the payment of the TRANs by June 30, 2020.

We have determined that the County's request is within the percentage limitation described above. Additionally, the cash flow forecast for the County's School Federal Projects Fund supports the County's ability to repay the TRANs by June 30, 2020.

#### Fiscal Year 2020 Budget

The County adopted its fiscal year 2020 budget on July 15, 2019.

#### **Debt Management Policy**

The County provided a copy of its debt management policy, and within forty-five days of issuance of the debt approved in this letter, is required to submit a Report on Debt Obligation that indicates that the debt issued complies with the County's debt policy. If the County amends its policy, please submit the amended policy to our office.

#### Tax and Revenue Anticipation Notes (TRANs) Approval

This letter constitutes approval for the issuance of TRANs as an interfund loan from the County's Debt Service Fund in the amount not to exceed \$1,000,000 for the County's School Federal Projects Fund. Approval of the sale of the Notes is conditioned upon the County's compliance with Title 9, Chapter 21, of the Tennessee Code Annotated and timely payment of outstanding note principal and interest in accordance with the note provisions.

The County Mayor and Commissioners shall comply with the following:

- The tax and revenue anticipation note form available on our website, or one prepared by legal counsel, shall be used as the loan document;
- A Report on Debt Obligation, Form CT-0253, shall be filed with the County Commission no later than 45 days after the issuance of the TRANs, with a copy filed with our office;
- A balanced budget shall be maintained with no cash deficits and sufficient to pay operating and debt service costs; and
- The TRANs shall be repaid no later than June 30, 2020, and documentation of repayment shall be provided to our office within 15 days of repayment, but no later than June 30, 2020.

This letter and the approval to issue debt do not address compliance with federal tax regulations and should not be relied upon for that purpose. The County should discuss these issues with a tax attorney or bond counsel.

#### Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board (MSRB) - Required Disclosure

Local governments that issue municipal securities on or after February 27, 2019, should be aware that the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) adopted amendments to Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities Exchange Act that require reporting on material financial obligations that could impact an issuer's financial condition or security holder's rights. The amendments add two events to the

list of events that must be included in any continuing disclosure agreement that is entered after the compliance date:

- Incurrence of a financial obligation of the issuer or obligated person, if material, or agreement to covenants, events of default, remedies, priority rights, or other similar terms of a financial obligation of the issuer or obligated person, any of which affect security holders, if material; and
- Default, event of acceleration, termination event, modification of terms, or other similar events under the terms of the financial obligation of the issuer or obligated person, any of which reflect financial difficulties.

#### Report on Debt Obligation

No public entity may enter into additional debt if it has failed to file the Report on Debt Obligation. 
