RESOLUTION TO ESTABLISH A CONSENT AGENDA AS PART OF THE INTERNAL OPERATING RULES OF THE MONTGOMERY COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

WHEREAS, the governing body of Montgomery County, Tennessee is the Montgomery County Commission which is governed by statute and otherwise has established its own rules and orderly procedures to conduct the business of Montgomery County, TN including governance by a Chair of the Commission duly elected each year and so encumbered with the duties to carry out the functions of the commission as Chair thereof; and

WHEREAS, in conducting the business of Montgomery County, Tennessee it as a legislative body that conducts monthly meetings to complete its business. WHEREAS, those items are sometimes, by their very nature, not controversial, possibly routine, and may be therefore approved as a single item on a "consent agenda" subject to the absolute right for any item to be removed from the consent agenda on the single request of any member of the body; and

RESOLUTION OF THE MONTGOMERY COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS APPROPRIATING FUNDS FOR DESIGN FEES FOR A TWELVE CLASSROOM ADDITION TO BARKSDALE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

WHEREAS, The Spanish Language Immersion Program was created at Barksdale Elementary in 2018; and,

WHEREAS, the program has grown from two classrooms in the first year to four classrooms in 2019-2020 and the program is expected to grow by two additional classrooms per year reaching twelve classrooms by 2023; and,

WHEREAS, Barksdale Elementary School has an enrollment of 608 students, which is 97% of the design capacity of the current building; and,

WHEREAS, Barksdale Elementary School will exceed its capacity due to growth within its boundary and from growth in the Spanish Language Immersion Program; and,

WHEREAS, the construction of a twelve classroom, two restroom addition is required to allow for projected growth in the school zone, and to meet the educational program needs for a school capacity of 825 students; and,

WHEREAS, the results of the schematic design phase will adequately address additional concerns at Barksdale Elementary including; general renovation of existing spaces, security concerns, ADA compliance within the building, fire and safety upgrades, utility upgrades, core capacity and significant site flow issues. The renovation will also include additions of an administrative suite, and an auxiliary gymnasium; now,

THEREORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Montgomery County Board of County Commissioners assembled in Regular Session on this 13th day of April, 2020 that this Commission expresses its intent to fund the construction of a twelve classroom addition to Barksdale Elementary School (currently estimated at \$7.4 million), and that a sum not to exceed \$433,200 be appropriated to the School Capital Projects Fund for the design and architect fees for this project.




