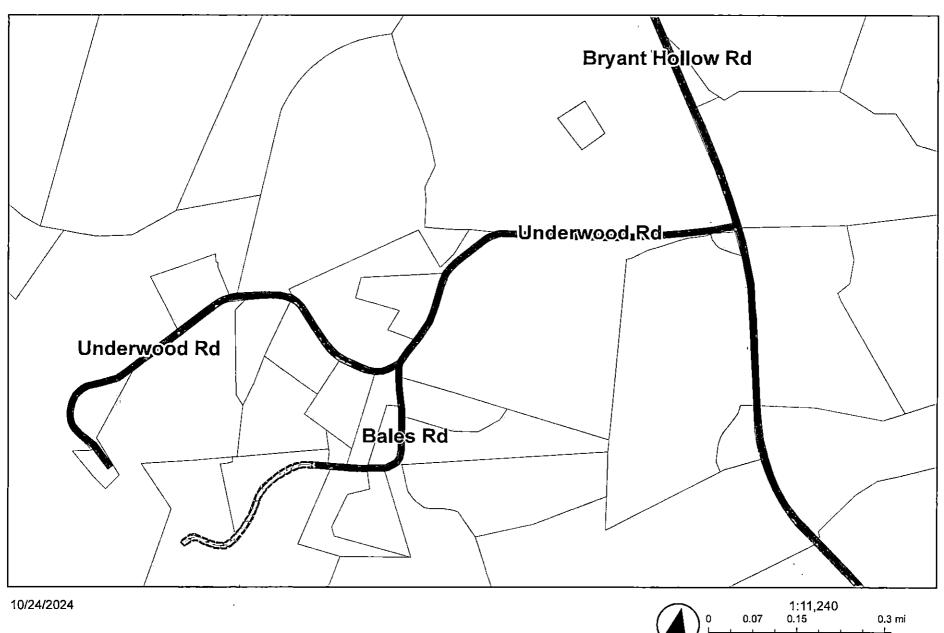

RESOLUTION AMENDING THE BUDGET OF THE MONTGOMERY COUNTY ANIMAL CARE AND CONTROL BY TRANSFERRING FUNDS FOR A PART TIME VETERINARY TECHNICIAN

WHEREAS, Montgomery County Animal Care & Control (MCACC) strives to provide excellent service to the citizens of Montgomery County; and

WHEREAS, MCACC continuously houses animals that are strays or have been surrendered and/or are up for adoption; and

WHEREAS, MCACC has now employed a Full-Time Shelter Veterinarian to provide ongoing daily medical care including surgical procedures on shelter animals to include spaying and neutering of unaltered animals; and

WHEREAS, the Full-Time Veterinarian requires the assistance of a Certified Veterinary Technician that specializes in assisting with the daily care and diagnoses of sick/injured animals, dispensing medications, as well as providing specialized assistance during surgical procedures. MCACC is requesting one (1) part-time Veterinary Technician position to support these efforts; and

WHEREAS, the annual cost of the part-time Veterinary Technician position is twenty-eight thousand three hundred thirty-seven dollars (\$28,337) and approximately eighteen thousand seven hundred twenty-tour dollars (\$18,724) is needed for the remainder of fiscal year 2025; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated §5-9-407 provides a procedure for amending the budget, specifically providing that "the budget, including line items and major categories, may be amended by passage of an amendment by a majority of the members of the county legislative body."

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Montgomery County Board of Commissioners assembled in regular session on this 12th day of November 2024, that the Montgomery County Animal Care & Control Fiscal Year 2025 operating budget is hereby amended as follows to add one (1) additional part-time Veterinary Technician position.

RESOLUTION TO APPROVE ELECTRONIC MONITORING AT WILL SERVICE AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, effective July 1, 2024, T.C.A. §40-11-152 was amended to generally require or allow the courts of Tennessee to order defendants arrested for certain crimes, such as domestic violence, stalking, etc., to wear a global positioning monitoring system device and pay the costs associated with operating that system as a condition of bail; and

WHEREAS, the statute further allows the alleged victim to opt-in/opt-out use of a corresponding device if a global positioning monitoring system device is so ordered as a condition of bail; and

WHEREAS, the statute was further amended to require each county to enter into a written agreement with a qualified contract service provider to provide global positioning monitoring systems; and

WHEREAS, Montgomery County utilized a Request for Proposal to identify such qualified contract service provider and now desires to enter into a written agreement with such provider to comply with the statutes and to provide these services under an agreement which may be terminated by either party upon thirty (30) days' notice; and

WHEREAS, Montgomery County likewise wishes to enter into any number of the same material agreements with other providers who meet the terms and conditions of the Statutes applicable.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the county legislative body for Montgomery County, Tennessee, meeting in regular session on the 12th day of November 2024, that:

SECTION 1. The Montgomery County Mayor is hereby authorized to execute, on behalf of Montgomery County, the contract attached hereto as Exhibit A and the officers of Montgomery County are authorized and directed to take all further action necessary to execute the purpose of this resolution. This resolution shall become effective upon its approval, the public welfare requiring it.

It is further authorized that the Montgomery County Mayor is hereby authorized to execute, on behalf of Montgomery County, the contract attached hereto as Exhibit A and the officers of Montgomery County are authorized and directed to take all further action necessary to execute the purpose of this resolution with any number of the same material agreements with other providers who meet the terms and conditions of the Statutes applicable. This resolution shall become effective upon its approval, the public welfare requiring it.

WRITTEN SERVICE PROVIDER AGREEMENT PURSUANT TO TENNESSEE CODE ANNOTATED §§ 40-11-150 and 40-11-152 FOR PROVIDING GPS MONITORING SYSTEMS

Comes now 911 Bail Bonding, LLC, hereinafter referred to as "Provider" and Montgomery County, Tennessee, a Governmental Entity, hereinafter referred to as "County" and pursuant to Tennessee Code Annotated §§ 40-11-150; 40-11-152; and 55-10-426, and enter into this Agreement pursuant to said provisions to provide Global Positioning Monitoring Systems when the same are ordered as a condition of release by the Court for the defendant and/or victim as defined therein.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. The term of this Agreement shall be for a period of one year commencing on the date the same has been fully executed by all parties and shall be automatically renewed annually unless either party notifies the other in writing of their intent not to renew not less than thirty (30) days before the expiry of the existing Agreement, and subject to the further terms and conditions set out herein.
- 2. This Agreement is **not exclusive**, and Provider acknowledges that the County may enter into the same or similar agreements with multiple other Providers for Global Positioning Monitoring Systems under the same material terms and conditions. This is the written agreement required by Tennessee Code Annotated §§ 40-11-152 (k).
- 3. The parties hereto acknowledge that the applicable statutes do not constitute services provided to the County but are services provided by the Provider to any "victim" and/or "defendant" contemplated by the statutes and the so ordered terms and conditions of release by the Court. The agreement to provide these statutorily compliant services is between the Provider and the "defendant" and "victim", not the County. Further, nothing herein creates a partnership or joint relationship between the County and the defendant, victim, or the Provider. This relationship is for the County to

complete compliance that is minimally necessary for the County to carry out the terms of the statutes, particularly required by T.C. A. §§ 40-11-152 (k). All charges for services of the Provider under these statutes are to be commercially reasonable for the date, location and type of services rendered and are at the sole responsibility and discretions of the contracting parties, Provider and/or Defendant, as to terms, payments, collections and original and continuing obligations. The County is never responsible for any obligations, costs, collections or payments to any party as a result of the services provided under this written agreement and the Statutes.

- 4. The parties agree that herein, the terms "defendant" and "victim" are those used and identified in the statutes and any reference to statutes means Tennessee Code Annotated §§ 40-11-150; 40-11-152; and 55-10-426.
- 5. The Provider acknowledges that the conditions of release so ordered by the court may include multiple directives and this agreement is only applicable to Global Positioning Monitoring Systems as contemplated by the statutes and does not imply how and with whom the defendant or victim may otherwise contract for other terms of conditions of release, for example bond.
- 6. In addition to the thirty (30) days written notice of non-renewal or termination as provided for herein above, the County, or the Provider may terminate this Agreement without any damages or penalty, or incur any further obligation to the other except for accounting for completion of all services undertaken and pending to a conclusion. This termination for convenience may be exercised by either party based upon their own sole discretion on thirty (30) days' written notice. If termination for convenience occurs, then the County shall have the right to expect full performance of all the duties set out herein and as required by the applicable statutes, and the Provider shall have the right to expect full payment for completion of all those pending services set out herein, but no others.
- 7. The County has cause for immediate termination if the Provider breaches any duty of the Statutes referenced herein or confidentiality or other duties required by other applicable statutes, and upon same determination will notify the court

of origin of the conditions of release of the breach.

- 8. Under the terms of this Agreement, the Provider shall provide all of the services contemplated by the Statutes, TENNESSEE CODE ANNOTATED §§ 40-11-150 and 40-11-152 for the Global Positioning Monitoring System, and in doing so, shall observe all the laws of the State of Tennessee and both State and Federal Constitutional Protections; shall comply with all the terms, duties, and responsibilities set out in the Statutes, and shall comply with all other statutory requirements, including but not limited to confidentiality or other duties required by other applicable statutes, in the handling of information given to it in order to perform its duties.
- 9. The Provider represents it is a "contract service provider" as defined in TENNESSEE CODE ANNOTATED §§ 55-10-426 and a "qualified service provider" as defined in Tennessee Code Annotated §§ 40-11-150; 40-11-152;
- 10. If the Court orders as a condition of release Global Positioning Satellite Monitoring Systems as required pursuant to the statutes cited herein, the Provider shall be provided with a telephone number and/or a location address for the victim for purposes of the placement of the system or device when the victim has made the choice to "opt in" of the proximity positioning feature and location services from the Magistrate, Court or Sheriff's Office. Any and all information obtained by the Provider regarding the victim is confidential information not to be disclosed to any other person or party in any respect. The Provider agrees to maintain this confidentiality. The Provider agrees that they will abide by the applicable statutes regarding confidentiality of victims. The victim contact information on opt-in/opt-out and the necessary contact information will be given to the Magistrate or the Court at the time the condition of release and Global Positioning Monitoring System is ordered. Provider agrees it will obtain this victim contact information from the BOND RELEASE AND GLOBAL MONITORING NOTIFICATION FORM located in the Montgomery County Jail Booking Office.
- 11. Pursuant to T. C. A. 40-11-152 a (2) b, i and e the Provider agree to the designation of Deputy Terry Helm at (931) 648-0611, ext. 13137 and email at

tahelm@mcgtn.net and Clarksville Montgomery County Emergency Communication District (E911) at 931-552-1011, each of them, immediately for alerts and notifications that Provider must make under the statutory duties. The Provider agrees that from time to time such designation may change and such will be noted in writing signed by all parties' representatives.

- 12. If the Provider is to place a statutorily compliant Global Positioning Monitoring System on the alleged Defendant, the same will occur at the place and location at the Montgomery County Jail described and identified by the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office, and shall include the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office maintenance of control and custody through and including a "check" of the device to make sure it is functioning properly before custody of the Defendant is released by the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office. The Sheriff's Office will confirm the system is functioning before confirming the conditions of the release. The arrangements for the placement of the Global Positioning Monitoring System device on the victim must occur and be verified if and when the victim has "opted in" to the system, before the Defendant can be released and the conditions of release are met. Verification of the Provider's placement of the system on any victim opting in will take place by the Provider presenting a written confirmation of existing placement on the victim having already occurred and the Sheriff's Office will confirm satisfaction of this condition of release by communicating directly with the victim. The Sheriff's Office confirmation on all points so ordered by the Court for release.
- 13. The Provider agrees to indemnify Montgomery, Tennessee, its subdivisions, departments, employees and personnel, from any and all liability asserted by any third party for any cause of action that may arise from the execution of the terms and conditions of this Agreement by the Provider.
- 14. This Agreement is limited to the Provider providing the services pursuant to the Statutes, and all cost and risk of loss for all equipment, labor, or any expense, is borne by the Provider in the execution of this Agreement with the Defendant and the victim and any other third parties, and all charges and costs of recovery are to be

negotiated and concluded by and between the Provider and the Defendant and the victim as required by the Statutes, and for which Montgomery County will have no liability for payment or collection otherwise.

- 15. The Global Positioning Monitoring System must meet all the requirements of the Statutes including all alerts and notifications, installation and removals. All hardware, accessories, software, and services, and all expenses shall be borne by the Provider and/or the Defendant or victim as allowed by Statute, and Montgomery County has no liability for the same.
- 16. <u>Status of Parties</u>. Nothing contained in this Agreement shall be construed as establishing a partnership or joint venture relationship between the parties hereto but simply establishes the written agreement required by the statutes.
- 17. <u>Assignment</u>. Neither this Agreement nor any rights or obligations hereunder shall be assigned by either party without prior written consent of the other party.
- 18. <u>Governing Law</u>. This Agreement and the rights and obligations of the parties hereunder shall be construed in accordance with and governed by the laws of the State of Tennessee, notwithstanding any conflicts of law rules to the contrary.
- 19. <u>Integration of Terms</u>. This instrument together with all attachments, exhibits and schedules constitutes the entire agreement between the parties, and supersedes all prior negotiations, commitments, representations and undertakings of the parties with respect to its subject matter.
- 20. <u>Amendment and Waiver</u>. This Agreement may be amended or modified only by an instrument signed by all of the parties.
 - 21. Third Party Beneficiaries. There are no third-party beneficiaries to this

Agreement.

RESOLUTION TO URGE THE TENNESSEE GENERAL ASSEMBLY TO ENACT A PRIVATE ACT CREATING AN ADDITIONAL GENERAL SESSIONS AND JUVENILE COURT, DIVISION V, IN MONTGOMERY COUNTY

WHEREAS, Montgomery County has experienced steady population growth resulting in the need for a new General Sessions and Juvenile Court; and

WHEREAS, currently Montgomery County has four (4) General Session Judges who exercise General Sessions and Juvenile Court jurisdiction concurrently; and

WHEREAS, in 1982, the Tennessee General Assembly adopted the Juvenile Court Restructure Act of 1982, which provided a process to establish a special Juvenile Court to provide services to Juveniles separate from adults. In 2019, the Tennessee General Assembly adopted the Juvenile Justice Reform Act, which provided more in-depth services to Juveniles and additional time and probation reviews to comply with the Act, causing more court time spent reviewing the cases; and

WHEREAS, Division IV of General Sessions and Juvenile Court was established in 2014 when the population of Montgomery County was 189,000; and

WHEREAS, in the past a General Sessions and Juvenile Court Judgeship has been established when the county population increased by 40,000. The population for Montgomery County was 176,619 in the 2010 census statistics. It is anticipated that the population of Montgomery County will be over 250,000, at the end of 2024, as the population is increasing at a rate between 28% and 38% between Census cycles; and

WHEREAS, at the current time, the Juvenile Court has exclusive jurisdiction of all cases to adjudicate a child dependent and neglected, delinquent and/or abandoned, and all other matters conferred upon such court by state law. General Sessions Court have jurisdiction over all adult criminal and misdemeanor and felony cases (preliminary hearings), child support enforcement, adult civil cases, and on two occasions, the General Sessions Judges also preside over the Recovery Courts; and

WHEREAS, the Montgomery County Board of Commissioners finds it in the interest of the citizens of Montgomery County to urge the Tennessee General Assembly to adopt legislation creating an additional division of General Sessions and Juvenile Court, Division V.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Montgomery County Board of Commissioners, assembled in regular business session this the 12th day of November 2024, that the Tennessee General Assembly approve and support the creation of Division V of the Montgomery County General Sessions and Juvenile Court:

SECTION 1. The Judge shall be elected in the 2026 August general election. The term of office shall be eight (8) years, and such Judge shall be licensed to practice law in the state of Tennessee and shall possess all the qualifications of the Courts. The elected Judge shall take and subscribe to the same oath of office as that subscribed for the Judges of the General Sessions and Juvenile Courts. In the event the office of the Judge shall become vacant by reason of death, resignation, retirement, or any other reason before the expiration of said term of office, such vacancy shall be filled by a majority vote of the Montgomery County Commission members until the next County general election.

SECTION 2. The Judge and Clerk of such Court shall have all of the jurisdiction, powers, duties, and authority of other Juvenile Court Judges and Clerks as provided in Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 37 or any other general law, and shall have all of the jurisdiction, powers, duties, and authority of the General Sessions Court Judges, pursuant to applicable state law.

SECTION 3. The Judge shall be a full time General Sessions and Juvenile Judge in Montgomery County.

SECTION 4. Effective upon appointment and following, the annual salary of the position of Montgomery County General Sessions and Juvenile Judge, Division V, shall be that of Division I, II, III & IV General Sessions & Juvenile Court Judges in Montgomery County. The Montgomery County Legislative Body shall annually appropriate from such funds as are necessary and appropriate for the orderly operation and administration of the court herein created.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that upon approval of this resolution and its signing, the Board of Commissioners directs the County Clerk's Office to mail a copy of this resolution to Montgomery County's State Representatives and State Senator.

- Archives Renovation: This is a possible project that was in future planning documents as needed for space growth. This project design will not until and if the Assessor of Property moves out of their current space, leaving available room for possible expansion of the Archives' storage.
- Assessor's New Office Renovation: DCS will be fully moved out by the end of November from their lease space in the Plaza. This area will become available for temporary office use for other Departments that are having work completed in their space, and is ultimately planned for the Assessor's office relocation unless their current space is renovated instead. Either way the new flexible office area is needed at the Plaza. The design phase has been halted until funding is approved



so as to not waste design time and expenses on unfunded projects. If funding is approved, this project will get added back into the design schedule.

- County Clerk: New service windows have been requested to increase the number of windows serving customers. A plan has been developed with the Clerk to utilize an existing storage room to build 6 to 7 new windows.
- Property Unit Power: More power is needed within the Property Units due to increased requests and expansion of offices. The existing power sources and breaker spaces have been fully utilized, and some form of an expansion is necessary to have additional circuits available as needed.
- Purchasing Updates: The Purchasing Office is slated for a renovation to better utilize the space made vacant from the old supply store. A bidding conference room will be developed along with office optimization. This project will also all the current Building & Codes office to expand their office count by capturing some of the unused space of Purchasing.

SUBJECT: Notification to Civilian Governing Body and Local Community

On May 25, 2022, Presidential Executive Order (EO) 14074 "Advancing Effective, Accountable Policing and Criminal Justice Practices to Enhance Public Trust and Public Safety" was signed.

In accordance with EO 14074 (Section 12), State, Tribal, local, and Territorial Law Enforcement agencies (LEAs) must:

All-Terrain Vehicles, Antennas, Binoculars, Container K9 transport, Explosive Ordinance Disposal Robot, Flood lights, Generator Sets, Heavy Equipment Vehicles, Up-Armored Vehicles, Medical and First Aid supplies, Office equipment and supplies, Pre Fab and Portable buildings, Ballistic Shields, Tents and Portable Shelters, Cargo Vehicles, Cold and Warm Weather Clothing, Mechanical Tools and Kits, Exercise Equipment, Kitchen Equipment, Office Equipment and Supplies, Waterborne Vessels, Shipping Containers, Construction Supplies, Refrigerators, and Cleaning Supplies.

Pursuant to EO 14074 (Section 12), this memo fulfills the requirement to notify the Civilian Governing Body (CGB) and Local Community of my agency's intent to request the controlled property items identified in the list above.
