RESOLUTION TO REQUEST UNCLAIMED BALANCE OF ACCOUNTS REMITTED TO STATE TREASURER UNDER UNCLAIMED PROPERTY ACT

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated Section 66-29-102 and Section 66-29-123, as amended by Public Chapter 401, Acts of 1985, provide that a municipality or county in Tennessee may request payment for the unclaimed balance of funds reported and remitted by or on behalf of the local government and its agencies if it exceeds \$100.00, less a proportionate share of the cost administering the program; and

WHEREAS, Montgomery County and/or its agencies have remitted unclaimed accounts to the State Treasurer in accordance with the Uniform Disposition of Unclaimed Property Act; and

RESOLUTION TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FROM THE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) PROGRAM ADDRESSING FOOD INSECURITY IN MONTGOMERY COUNTY, TENNESSEE

WHEREAS, the federal government has made funds available for local governments to address food insecurity in their respective districts; and

WHEREAS, these funds will be administered through the Tennessee Department of Economic and Community Development in the form of a reimbursable grant to provide to local governments; and

WHEREAS, Montgomery County received an award of \$500,000 to be used for the purpose of purchasing equipment and supplies needed to increase capacity with partner agencies in the county; and

WHEREAS, the award amount was less than the overall ask amount and final decisions about partner agencies' asks are to be made by the Montgomery County Mayor's Office based on the partner agencies' input; and

WHEREAS, no matching funds are required for this grant by Montgomery County Government; and

WHEREAS, the grant period to complete grant activities began December 15, 2023, and ends June 30, 2026; and

WHEREAS, the Montgomery County Board of Commissioners previously passed Resolution 23-1-1 to apply for and participate in the Community Development Block Grant.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Montgomery County Board of Commissioners assembled in regular session on this 13th day of May 2024, that the Montgomery County Legislative Body will approve appropriation of funds for the amount of five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000); and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Mayor is authorized to execute an agreement and other necessary documents required to signify acceptance of grant funds from the Tennessee Department of Economic and Community Development. Upon receipt of the fully executed grant agreement, the Director of Accounts and Budgets shall establish the necessary fund accounts providing for related revenues and expenditures stated in the contract, this resolution intends to have the effect of appropriation to that purpose accordingly.

RESOLUTION TO APPLY FOR FUNDS FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY'S STAFFING FOR ADEQUATE FIRE AND EMERGENCY RESPONSE (SAFER) GRANT PROGRAM IN SUPPORT OF MONTGOMERY COUNTY VOLUNTEER FIRE SERVICE

WHEREAS, Montgomery County is one of the fastest growing communities in Tennessee, and the Montgomery County Volunteer Fire Service must continue to adapt to efficiently and effectively meet the needs of the citizens of Montgomery County; and

WHEREAS, the Montgomery County Volunteer Fire Service desires to apply for funding from the SAFER Grant Program to support the hire of thirty-six full-time operational positions for the department; and

WHEREAS, if awarded, funding from this grant program will be made by advancement or reimbursement from FEMA for the period of thirty-six months for a total of seven million, five hundred eighteen thousand, five hundred twenty-eight dollars (\$7,518,528) to cover salary and benefits for these thirty-six requested positions over this grant period; and

WHEREAS, the aforementioned grant period would span the County's FY2025, FY2026, FY2027, and FY2028, beginning 180 days after FEMA approves the application for an award; and

WHEREAS, the anticipated funding selection date as listed in the NOFO by FEMA is to be no later than July 31, 2024.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Montgomery County Board of Commissioners assembled in Regular Session on this 13th day of May 2024 that the Montgomery County Legislative Body will approve application to the SAFER Grant Program for the amount of seven million, five hundred eighteen thousand, five hundred twenty-eight dollars (\$7,518,528) with the intention, if awarded, to appropriate funds for the purpose of hiring the proposed thirty-six full-time operational positions for Montgomery County Volunteer Fire Service.

RESOLUTION TO APPLY FOR FUNDS FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY'S PORT SECURITY GRANT PROGRAM (PSGP) IN SUPPORT OF MONTGOMERY COUNTY VOLUNTEER FIRE SERVICE

WHEREAS, Montgomery County is one of the fastest growing communities in Tennessee, and the Montgomery County Volunteer Fire Service must continue to adapt to efficiently and effectively meet the needs of the citizens of Montgomery County; and

WHEREAS, the Montgomery County Volunteer Fire Service desires to apply for funding from the Port Security Grant Program to support the purchase of a boat and related equipment, such as sonar, boat trailer, etc., to outfit said boat for a projected amount of \$195,000; and

WHEREAS, to apply, Montgomery County must commit to the cost-share or match requirement of 25% of the total amount of all project costs as submitted in the application and approved in the award (projected amount of \$48,750); and

WHEREAS, the anticipated funding selection date as listed in the NOFO by FEMA is to be no later than August 23, 2024.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Montgomery County Board of Commissioners assembled in Regular Session on this 13th day of May 2024, that the Montgomery County Legislative Body will approve application to the Port Security Grant Program for the projected amount of \$195,000, which includes a 25% cost-share commitment from Montgomery County, with the intention, if awarded, to appropriate funds for the purpose of purchasing a boat and necessary equipment for the Montgomery County Volunteer Fire Service.

RESOLUTION TO UPDATE THE CREATION OF THE MONTGOMERY COUNTY FIRE SERVICE

WHEREAS, the Montgomery County Quarterly Court assembled in regular business session on the 12th day of April 1976, authorized and directed the County Judge to execute on behalf of the county a certain agreement with the Montgomery County Rescue Squad, for the purpose of providing fire protection service primarily for the unincorporated areas of Montgomery County; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of this resolution is to update the creation of the Montgomery County Volunteer Fire Service pursuant to Tennessee Code Annotated; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 5-17-101(a) authorizes the county legislative body to form a new agency to be known as the county-wide fire department for the purpose of providing fire protection services to the county; and

WHEREAS, Montgomery County has a need for a county fire department to provide fire protection and rescue services in the unincorporated areas of Montgomery County; and

WHEREAS, the Montgomery County Board of Commissioners recognizes the vulnerability of the county to emergencies and disasters in the county; and

WHEREAS, the Montgomery County Board of Commissioners is desirous that emergency services be provided to all Montgomery County citizens.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Montgomery County Board of Commissioners assembled at a regular session on this the 13th day of May 2024, that:

- 1. Pursuant to the provisions of Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 5-17-101(a) there is hereby created a county-wide fire department to be known as Montgomery County Fire Service which shall have the powers and duties set forth in Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 5-17-102.
- 2. The unincorporated areas of Montgomery County are designated as fire service districts.

3. The Montgomery County Fire Service shall be funded exclusively from revenues generated by Tennessee Code Annotated § 5-17-101(d). Beginning July 1, 2024, such revenue for the use of the Montgomery County Fire Service shall be allocated to a special fund which shall be created and established, and which shall be known as the Montgomery County Fire Protection Fund #121. Revenues shall be allocated to the Montgomery County Fire Protection Fund and appropriated to the use of the Montgomery County Fire Service through regular budgetary and appropriation process of Montgomery County, Tennessee, subject to the restrictions provided by this Resolution.

RESOLUTION TO ESTABLISH ARPA FUNDING OF EXTENSION OF WATER UTILITY FOR CUNNINGHAM UTILITY DISTRICT

WHEREAS, Montgomery County, Tennessee, has received funds from the American Rescue Plan Act for use on defined projects: and

WHEREAS, heretofore, the citizens of Montgomery County, in certain areas as described herein, have not had access to a water utility, and without an extension of the Cunningham Utility District will not in the foreseeable future; and

WHEREAS, the Cunningham Utility District is willing to expand and provide service in areas of Montgomery County where no service currently exists as shown in Exhibit A hereto; and

WHEREAS, the engineering plans for the extension have been completed at a preliminary level of 95%, and the cost of the project is estimated to require the Utility to spend more than \$2,300,000.00 to complete the project; and

WHEREAS, the Utility has already confirmed interest in the community for the project with community meetings in May of 2022 and in April of 2024 and is prepared to complete the project with Grant funds of \$1.8 million, "tap fees", revenues or other funds to complete the total estimated cost of \$2.3 million; and

WHEREAS, for funding the to be complete, funding of a portion of the tap fees from Montgomery County, Tennessee is requested by the District not to exceed \$200,000.00 which can come from existing American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds of Montgomery County, TN; and

WHEREAS, these funds will be paid to the District when the District has executed commitment documents for undertaking the project.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Montgomery County Board of Commissioners assembled in regular business session on this 13th day of May 2024, that Montgomery County Tennessee will transfer \$200,000.00 from APRA Funds upon execution of contacts of commitments by the Cunningham Utility District for its expansion. If any fund balance remains after fulfilling the three priorities, it may to applied then further to the overall cost of the project.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Montgomery County office of Accounting and Budgets will promulgate rules for the Utility to confirm when documents have been executed to transfer payment of the monies as the project is completed.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the expansion area is as that shown on Exhibit A hereto.
